

INFORMAL MINUTES OF MEETING OF CRAIGLEITH AND BLACKHALL
COMMUNITYCOUNCIL ON 7 OCTOBER 2013, IN STEWART'S MELVILLE COLLEGE 6TH
YEAR ROOM

Due to unforeseen circumstance Cllr Gavin Barrie was unable to attend and conduct the election of office bearers.

The former CBCC Councillors decided to continue with the meeting in an informal capacity.

Caroline Burwell from the CEC updated on a number of road safety issues. On the Craigleith junction, which sees 10,000 vehicles per day, only three accidents had occurred in the last 5 years, in different locations with no pattern. She also advised that there was little that could be done to speed up green man sequencing. In the Blackhall dip, there had been 17 collisions over a three year period, the majority relating to vehicles diving too close together. Some of the measures the CEC were considering for the community under the shopping street concept include the roll out of 20mph programme and additional road markings and single lanes. Proposals will be put to the CBCC for further consultation.

Irene Hamilton, local resident, updated with some positive news on the Hillpark french drain issue. After appeal and much pressure from Irene and her husband, Scottish Water have given permission to connect to the mains and Mactaggart and Mickel will start work later this month.

Section 75 – CEC will share a document shortly to shed more light on missing monies.
